
Master of Social Work (Qualifying)

What You Will Study

YEAR 1

YEAR 2

In year two, you will study practice based subjects including health and mental health, children and families, research, working with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and communities and professional placement.

Entry Requirements

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree in social sciences, psychology, public health, education, nursing, or a related undergraduate qualification with at least one year of Social Science content (i.e. studies of the individual and society).

As a core requirement for this course, all students are required to undergo a National Criminal Record Check and Working With Children Check. Students in NSW Health professional placements are required to comply with NSW Health's immunisation requirements.

International students are also required to meet the below listed English requirements to gain admission into this program.

Accreditation

The Master of Social Work (Qualifying) is an AASW provisionally accredited qualification. This accreditation is an entry qualification into the social work profession and has been determined to meet the Australian Social Work Education and Accreditation Standards 2012 (ASWEAS). All graduates of this course have the same standing as graduates from all other AASW accredited courses and are eligible for membership of the AASW, which is required by many employers.

Graduates will also be required to meet AASW English language requirements for migration and/or employment purposes.
