Bachelor of Public Health





Public Health is the art and science of promoting healthy people, places and policies. Public Health strives to improve the health and quality of life of a population, by working to prevent disease, prolong life, and promote health. Studies in Public Health empower students to make significant contributions to society.

Students will explore health issues from multiple perspectives – social, environmental, physical, cultural and political - and will develop a range of professional skills to empower them to be agents of change in a variety of work environment. This degree will provide you with an understanding of the key issues affecting the health of populations. You will develop a range of professional skills: obtain, review and analyse information; persuasively communicate health information and challenges using a variety of media; plan and manage a health program or project; undertake health research; work with and strengthen communities; and advocate to improve the health of populations. High achieving students can undertake an Honours year at the conclusion of the degree to further develop and apply their research and practice skills. Professional Recognition Graduates can apply to be a full member of the Public Health Association of Australia.

Majors

The Bachelor of Public Health at uow has three majors. Students can choose to specialise in one of the following:

HEALTH PROMOTION

The Health Promotion major has a focus on developing students' skills to promote and protect people's health through individual, community and population initiatives. This major applies social determinants of a health framework and is based on the principles of promoting social justice and reducing health inequity; promoting inclusiveness; and establishing sustainable physical, social and economic environments that are supportive of all people.

Following successful completion of the health promotion major, students will be qualified to take advantage of the career opportunities in local, national and international health organisations; multinational corporations; community organisations; statutory authorities; and a variety of government departments.

FOOD AND SOCIETY

The aim of the Food and Society major is to empower students to innovate and develop approaches to positively impact on community and population health outcomes through foodfocussed initiatives. Graduates will be equipped to work with communities, organisations and governments to advocate for and create healthy and sustainable food environments, identify, analyse and develop strategies to address key issues within the food system, undertake food education and communication, and use their knowledge to create large scale food changes in the population.

SOCIAL EPIDEMIOLOGY

This major aims to equip students with the skills to understand patterns, causes, and control of disease in human populations and address the societal risk factors that affect health and well-being of populations. Students will translate data into evidence to inform policy decisions and evidence-based practice and will graduate with the knowledge and skills to navigate health, social and welfare datasets.
